“I’M Gonna Be Your Friend” to stop famine in the Horn of Africa

It is hoped a Bob Marley song will help bring awareness to the thousands suffering from the famine in the Horn of Africa.

"I'm Gonna Be Your Friend" is a campaign which seeks to bring together celebrity power to gather support and assistance for the 12 million persons in the Eastern Africa who are terribly affected, ill and dying due to famine.

"I'm Gonna Be Your Friend" is a line from the Hon. Bob Marley's song "High Tide Or Low Tide." In it he expresses his unconditional friendship through good times and bad times. That is the sort of genuine friendship that we all hope and wish for in life.

East Africa (Somalia and Ethiopia) is now experiencing one of the worst famines ever. We who are able should help end the hunger and thirst of the suffering people in the motherland.

Hon. Bob Marley's song is the soundtrack to a short film (see http://www.youtube.com/watch?feature=player_embedded&v=eTJVQKra7gA) on the catastrophe that has hit the Horn of Africa. Proceeds from the film will be donated to Save the Children for the famine victims.

Marley family members and hundreds of other celebrities from around they globe have pledged to help bring awareness, raise funds for the crisis and promote the video by posting it on Twitter and or on



their Face-book pages. Those celebrities together have a following of more than 700 hundred million on those social networks.

Marley family matriarch, Mrs. Rita Marley voiced support for the campaign by stating "Not one child should be denied food nor water. Not one child should suffer. Along with Save the Children, we must stand up together as friends to put a stop to this, to feed our children and to save their lives."

We urge you to help alleviate the plight of our hungry, thirsty homeless, suffering and dying brothers and sisters in need. If each person gives just USD\$1, we would raise \$700 million dollars to end the famine in East Africa. Yes, together we can do it!
